
What is the problem? The problem is that since 1991, due to the introduction of paid education services, the number of higher education institutions has dramatically grown in Russia - if I am not mistaken, between 1991 and 2012, the number of universities and branches has almost doubled in different cities. And, unfortunately, the quality of training in these institutions left much to be desired. Many of them just turned into rubber stamps for diplomas. But such specialists, who buy their diplomas, are not in demand. This led to problems. A person graduates from a higher education institution or a branch of even a respected university, starts working and can do nothing, so he or she must be retrained. There is no use for such specialists. The percentage of those not working in the field they were trained in was enormous. That is why we launched those soft reforms in 2012, as it was called. And the number of higher education institutions has decreased since that by more than 30 percent, and the number of branches has fallen by more than 60 percent.






