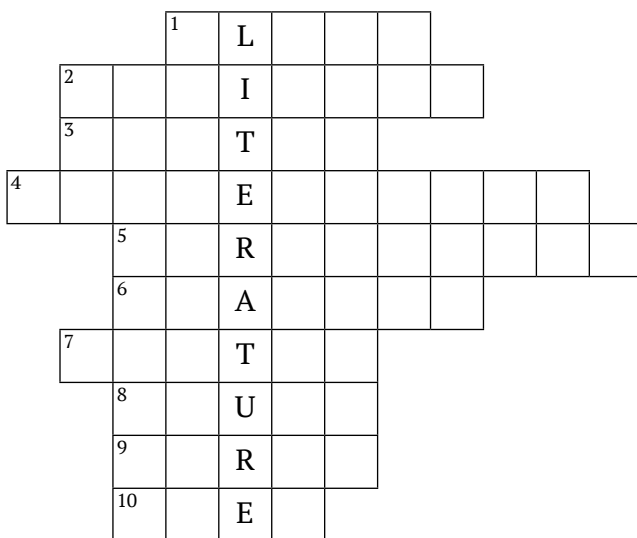

6. considered by many to be “the Father of English Literature” and the greatest poet of the Middle Ages

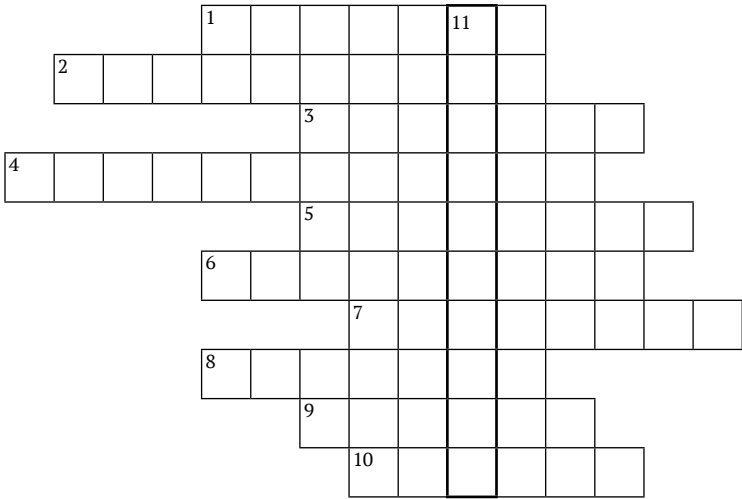
